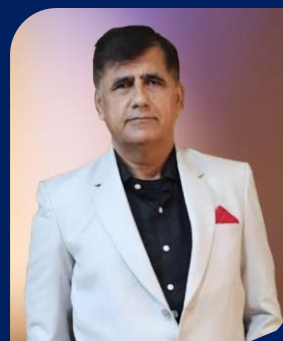

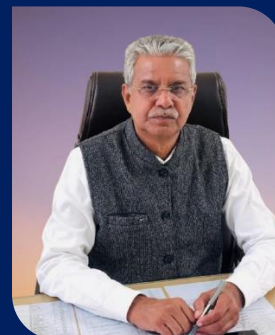

Webinar Overview

This webinar explores the resilience of the Indian economy through the lens of tax and structural reforms.

Background

Since independence, India's indirect tax system has undergone gradual reforms aimed at reducing fragmentation, curbing cascading taxation, and strengthening the fiscal base. This long journey laid the groundwork for the introduction of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) in 2017, which unified the domestic market under a single destination-based tax framework.

Focus

The discussion will highlight the recent GST 2.0 reforms that rationalised rate structures, simplified compliance, and enhanced revenue mechanisms. Alongside broader reforms in finance, digital public infrastructure, labour, and agriculture, these changes have reinforced India's capacity to absorb shocks and promote sustainable economic development.

Takeaway

The webinar synthesises evidence and policy perspectives to show how coherent tax design, combined with structural reform, strengthens macroeconomic variables and supports inclusive, shock-resilient growth.

Submission Highlights:

- **Cover Page:** Title, author name(s), designation, affiliation, and email
- **Abstract:** ~250 words with 4–5 **keywords** and relevant **JEL codes**. Clearly outline problem, methodology, findings, and practical implications.
- **Full Paper:** ~4000 words, Times New Roman 12 pt (*Arial Unicode MS*– for Hindi), single column, 1.15 line spacing, 1” margins, fully justified.
- **Case Studies / Book Reviews:** ~2000 words (4 pages).
- **Tables & Figures:** Numbered, self-explanatory; titles above, sources below.
- **References:** APA (7th edition), single-space, 10 pt font.
- **Plagiarism:** Must be original; similarity index $\leq 15\%$ and AI score $\leq 30\%$.

Other Guidelines:

- Submissions must be original and not under review elsewhere.
- Peer review may take 4–6 weeks; reviewer/editor decisions are final.
- Ethical conduct is mandatory; canvassing is prohibited.
